Awards

Ribbons will be awarded for appropriate placings of projects in their respective classes. i.e. 1st, 2nd, 3rd etc.

Rosettes and Banners awarded to Champions and Reserve Champions

Buckles awarded to Sr & Jr Grand and Reserve Overall Champions.

Banners will be awarded to reserve champions in showmanship.

Prizes, when available, will be awarded.

Each Division I and II has a Sr Grand Champion and Sr Reserve Champion

Division, I will also have a Jr Champion & Jr Reserve Champion

SHOWMANSHIP AWARD: In each Division

Division I will have a Senior Champion & Reserve Champion

Showmanship Division I will have a Junior Champion & Reserve Champion Showmanship

Junior Division (13 years of age and under), individual and/or group.

Senior Division (14 years of age and older), individual and or group

All ages will be as of Monday, June 15th 2026

Projects will be judged against all projects competing in their class. The first-place project in each class will advance and compete for the grand champion and reserve champion.

Projects will be judged on the following system

Workmanship.....	30 points
Degree of Difficulty.....	15 points
Design	15 points
Knowledge.....	30 points
Practical.....	10 points
Documentation.....	(Not Required)

Rules

1. Projects exhibited must have been constructed and fabricated by FFA and 4-H members as a part of their agricultural mechanics instruction in the Agricultural Science class or as part of their supervised work experience program.
2. All exhibitors must be present at their projects during judging. Freestone County Fair & Rodeo Agriculture Mechanics Show
3. In the event of an emergency preventing an exhibitor from showing, a substitute exhibitor will be allowed. A letter from the exhibitor explaining the reason for the missing and

listing the substitute must be approved by their AST/4-H advisor and submitted to the show superintendent before the show.

4. All projects must be clean, painted, or treated and in a presentable condition.
5. A working plan, blueprint, or drawing, and photographs showing construction and bill of materials are not required to be submitted with each project entered. But can be. No penalty either way.
6. All projects are to be identified by signs that include the chapter or club and advisor contact information.
7. The project must have been constructed within one calendar year of the exhibition date.
8. Projects may have been individually or group-constructed and owned.
9. Appropriate and safe display stands must be provided for gates, panels, and other projects that need support. Sharp edges and points, such as those found on self-feeder, roofs, bale movers, etc., are to be padded or covered as necessary to prevent injury.
10. All trailers and other projects to be towed on public roads must meet current Texas Department of Transportation (TXDOT) regulations.
11. There is to be no more than two gallons of fuel in any fuel tank. The fuel tank cap is to be in place and sealed with tape. This applies to all engines in the exhibit area.
12. No "For Sale" signs may be placed on projects during the day of the show. The exhibitor may sell their projects in private.
13. Exhibitor must be present at checkout and present their exhibitor card (if used)

14. Projects may not leave the show ground before check out on Monday following the show.
15. All judges' decisions and announced results will be final.
16. An entry fee of \$25.00 will be charged per project entered.
17. **Entries must be completed ONLINE @ www.fairentry.com**
18. All Entries are Due by April 30th, 2026. **No LATE** Entries. Entries will be completed in the Fair Entry System www.fairentry.com
19. SHOW ENTRIES: The exhibitor, his or her parent, or the Ag Teacher/CEA is responsible for inputting the information for entering the FCFA Livestock Show into the Fair Entry software program. You must pay the entry fee online.
20. PAYMENT IS DUE at the time of Entry
